ArcticNet is a non-for-profit organization that brings together hundreds of Arctic researchers, engineers, and managers studying human health, natural, and social sciences in the Arctic. With partners from Inuit and First Nations organizations, northern communities, 40+ Canadian post-secondary institutions, and multiple federal and provincial government agencies, ArcticNet works collaboratively with national and international research teams across the globe to study the impacts of rapid climate, environmental and socio-economic change. ArcticNet's knowledge mobilization program works to support the uptake of Arctic Indigenous and scientific knowledges to influence policy development, inform capacity building activities, support adaptation strategies, and ultimately benefit Northern communities and broader society.

WORK SUMMARY

ArcticNet is currently seeking a motivated Inuk (Inuit) or First Nations **Knowledge Mobilization Intern** to help support the exchange of Arctic knowledge between communities, scientists, policymakers, industry, and the public. You will receive training for all tasks (no experience necessary) and work under the supervision of the Knowledge Mobilization Manager. To inform ArcticNet's knowledge mobilization strategy, you will learn how to and help conduct a systematic literature review to identify best practices for knowledge mobilization that can catalyze positive change. You will also be responsible for assisting with organizing and coordinating knowledge mobilization activities (which may include webinars, podcasts, blogs, workshops, etc.) for our network.

ACTIVITIES

- Receive training on how to conduct a systematic literature review. This includes learning how to search databases for relevant sources, how to critically read academic articles, how to conduct qualitative analysis, and how to synthesize findings
- Co-write and co-author a peer-reviewed article with the findings of our systematic review
- Assist with organizing and coordinating knowledge mobilization activities (including webinars, podcasts, blogs, workshops, etc.)
- Share your own ideas for ArcticNet's knowledge mobilization strategy and activities
- Other tasks (e.g. creative work, radio) depending on your skills and interests

- Must be enrolled in a postsecondary program
- Excellent verbal and written English
