ArcticNet is a non-for-profit organization that brings together hundreds of Arctic researchers, engineers, and managers studying human health, natural, and social sciences in the Arctic. With partners from Inuit and First Nations organizations, northern communities, 40+ Canadian post-secondary institutions, and multiple federal and provincial government agencies, ArcticNet works collaboratively with national and international research teams across the globe to study the impacts of rapid climate, environmental and socio-economic change. ArcticNet's knowledge mobilization program works to support the uptake of Arctic Indigenous and scientific knowledges to influence policy development, inform capacity building activities, support adaptation strategies, and ultimately benefit Northern communities and broader society.

WORK SUMMARY

ArcticNet is currently seeking a motivated youth **Knowledge Mobilization Coordinator** to help support the exchange of Arctic knowledge between Northern communities, scientists, policymakers, industry, and the public. The coordinator will work under the supervision of the Knowledge Mobilization Manager. To inform ArcticNet's knowledge mobilization strategy, the coordinator will learn how to, and help conduct, a systematic literature review to identify best practices for knowledge mobilization that can catalyze positive change. They will also be responsible for assisting with organizing and coordinating knowledge mobilization activities (which may include webinars, podcasts, blogs, workshops, etc.) for our network. We are looking for a coordinator with artistic abilities to help improve science literacy through art.

- Contribute to a systematic literature review for publication (including searching, screening, synthesizing, writing, and editing)
- Create illustrations to communicate scientific research to wider audiences
- Assist with organizing and coordinating knowledge mobilization activities (including webinars, podcasts, blogs, workshops, policy briefs, etc.)
- Other tasks (e.g. creative work, radio) depending on your skills and interests
- Help coordinate the production of short videos on emerging Arctic research
- Help coordinate the production of postcards on emerging Arctic research
- Help organize events for ArcticNet's Annual Scientific Meeting
- Develop an ethical research toolkit in collaboration with our partner organizations
- Share your own ideas for ArcticNet's knowledge mobilization strategy and activities
